

# **THE CLUB**

Lutterworth Golf Club was formed as a “members’ club” in 1904 with a membership of 59. We are proud to be one of the oldest clubs in Leicestershire; we are still a members club but now with a membership of around 700.

The golf course was just 9 holes until 1979 when a further 6 holes were added. In 1987 a further 3 holes were added making it an 18 hole course for the first time. In the early 1990’s the compensation for the construction of the southern bypass, which took land from the golf course, allowed the club to purchase more land and construct a further 4 holes, this permitted a new layout and a longer course which is the one we play today.

In 1996 the old wooden clubhouse was demolished and the current clubhouse constructed.

Throughout its history, the members, through the elected committee, have tried to produce a course in the best condition and a clubhouse and associated infrastructure that provided the members with good facilities and social events. This is always a difficult job particularly balancing the ever increasing cost of maintaining the course and keeping the subscriptions at a reasonable level.

The committee is held to account every year through the AGM which always takes place at the end of November. We would like to encourage all new members to come along to the AGM where they can air their views and learn about the future plans for the club.

## THE COURSE

The club places an emphasis on maintaining the course in good condition and the greens are currently considered as among the best in the county.

With plenty of established trees and an ongoing tree planting programme, the presence of a number of ponds and the meandering river Swift, the course places a premium on accuracy.

The course is a good test of golf and there are a number of holes worthy of a special mention. The par 3 4<sup>th</sup>, with the river Swift on the left, requires an accurate tee shot as bailing out to the right leaves a very tricky shot to the narrow green. The long par 4 8<sup>th</sup> requires a long straight drive to give any chance of going for the green in two. The par 4 14<sup>th</sup> is a slight dogleg left and is protected by strategic bunkers and trees. Two good shots are needed to reach the narrow elevated green in regulation. The par 3 15<sup>th</sup> looks easy and is guarded by a tree on the left, a small pond and a new pot bunker – a par is always good here. Take a deep breath on the 16<sup>th</sup>, a sharp left hand dogleg with out of bounds on the left, a good drive and you are OK, but this hole has wrecked many a good card.

## **DRESS CODE**

Whilst Lutterworth Golf Club aims to promote a friendly and relaxed atmosphere, we do seek to maintain an acceptable standard of dress, both on the course and in the clubhouse. You should be aware that anyone not complying with the Dress Code may be asked to leave the course or clubhouse.

### **Standard of Dress**

Members and visitors should be appropriately dressed for the occasion. In order to maintain a reasonable standard of dress on the course and in the clubhouse, some examples (but obviously not all) of acceptable and unacceptable dress are provided below.

Casual attire may be worn at private functions.

Team captains should advise team members and visiting team captains of post match dress requirements.

### **Acceptable Examples**

Jackets and ties, or smart casual clothes, including clean golf wear (excluding golf shoes) may be worn in the clubhouse at any time. Recognised golf and casual wear may be worn on the course. Shirts should be tucked into shorts/trousers. Gentlemen may wear tailored shorts with knee length or light coloured sports socks.

Tailored shirts designed to be worn outside of trousers may be worn in the clubhouse. Guidance on ladies golf wear is detailed in the Ladies Locker Room.

### **Unacceptable Examples**

Collarless T-shirts; singlets; sweaters with slogans that could be considered to be offensive; tracksuits; trainer socks with shorts; stocking feet and shoes without socks (men), trainers (except for under 12s).

### **Departure from Dress Code**

To facilitate events such as golf taster sessions, the Committee may authorise relaxation from the Dress Code.

### **General**

It is the responsibility of all members to ensure that the Dress Code is complied with.

### **Changing Rooms**

Ladies and Gentlemen's changing rooms both have codes for their doors.

The codes are available from The Office or the Pro Shop.

## **MOBILE TELEPHONES**

These should be switched off whilst on the course. When in the clubhouse, telephones should be set to silent and any necessary calls should be made in the foyer.

## DOS AND DON'TS (GOLFING ETIQUETTE)

These are just some of the points of golfing etiquette of which you should be aware:

<b>DOS</b>	<b>DON'TS</b>
Shirts must be tucked in	Take trolleys on tees and greens
Mark your score card while others are playing	Make any noise when anyone is playing near you
Be prepared and ready to play as soon as it is your turn	Take trolleys between bunkers and the green
Whenever possible play your shot before looking for your partner's ball	Wear ordinary shoes or trainers (golf shoes only)
Keep up with the match in front of you	Wear jeans on the course
Make sure your clubs are left at the side of the green nearest to the next tee	Spend too long at the halfway house
Make sure you repair all divots and pitch marks on the green	Be noisy when out on the course
Have a good knowledge of the rules (local rules can be found inside your scorecard)	
Be aware of other players on the course. Shout 'fore' if you hit your ball in the direction of other players
